

#### "We need Generosity of Spirit in the present state of the church."

This was spoken by a wise retired pastor when two dozen members from Erie Conference Lutheran churches gathered in mid-October. The purpose of the meeting was to bring together representatives from all corners of the Conference to consider how we can support each other's ministries in an environment of declining attendance and resources.

For some congregations in our Erie Conference, and also in our NWPA Synod, difficult times have led them to close their doors and to encourage their remaining members to find new church homes. For some congregations, the answer has been to merge intentionally with another congregation. For still others, partnerships have developed to allow each church to receive pastoral care while maintaining their original congregational identities.

Rev. Jean Kuebler, pastor of Faith Lutheran Church in Harborcreek, and new Dean of the Erie Conference, led the recent meeting at Mount Calvary Church. It was good to meet face to face, not just on computer screens! The people in the circle of chairs come from various situations, some in churches with pastors, some in churches without. Some of us wondered how two churches could enter into a pastor-sharing arrangement. What would happen with Sunday worship times, meetings, and budgets? A few churches have been in the research and planning stages, working on the details to encourage acceptance by members in both congregations.

Several pastors and lay attendees have worshiped in the one-pastor-two-churches environment. Paired congregations can enjoy both individual and joint activities, and both have the security of pastoral care when ordained ministers and funding are less available. Pastors have the challenge of meeting the competing expectations of both groups, and often delivering two sermons in quick succession on a Sunday morning, with a commute between locations. St. John's Girard and St. James Fairview have an elegant solution—they share both a pastor and a deacon, with the two trading pulpits on alternate Sundays. These two West County congregations have much to offer other groups in the Erie Conference about the ways that they developed their successful partnership.

Will St. John's Erie ever be in a shared pastoral situation? It's hard to say. In the meantime, it is helpful to know that our sisters and brothers in other churches are exploring and finding ways to continue fellowship. As we respond to changing times, we pray to embody a Generosity of Spirit, and to follow the Lord's good guidance.
