

Social Statements

If you, like most people in North America, have a mobile phone, you may be using "apps," or applications, connecting with the world on social media. Some phone users stick to email or simple messages to reach out to a select group of family and friends. Still others share messages, photos, and video clips of their own making, and view the messages, photos, and video clips by others, depicting their families, pets, concerts, sports, political opinions, jokes, and pleas for help in difficult circumstances. All of these could be called our personal "Social Statements," communications with the segments of society that matter to us.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) has issued thirteen Social Statements since 1991, expressing ideas on how we as Christians and Lutherans view topics of interest to a healthy society. Caring for Creation, Church in Society, Economic Life, Education, and Peace are among the topics you can find on this website: https://elca.org/Faith/Faith-and-Society/Social-Statements

At the Bishops Day of Learning held for our Synod at St. Paul's Lutheran Church on May 4th, one of the speakers introduced a proposed new ELCA *Social Statement on Civic Life and Faith*. A Task Force began its work in 2020, and now invites church members to read and comment on a draft document. Following Luther's use of a Short Catechism, the task force created a short version of 10 pages and 48 Articles, divided among six sections. Section IV, for example, is "Religion and the First Amendment." The full version treats all 48 Articles in about 40 pages, with a Glossary beginning on page 52. The document and a survey for our feedback can be found online by searching "ELCA Civic Life and Faith." September 30, 2024, is the deadline for comments. The Task Force will continue its work to present the Social Statement for a vote at the 2025 Church Wide Assembly.

The topic of Civic Life and Faith is meaty, and so much more to chew on than a colorful social media photo of the food we order at our favorite restaurant. Quoting from Short Statement Article 1: "Daily we are to pray as Jesus taught: 'Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread.' These words teach us that God's will seeks the well-being of creation and all aspects of human life, including civil society." Quite an opening for this Social Statement.

Recruiting for St. John's CROP Walk Team!

Diane Bestvina and Carolyn Sturtevant represented St. John's at the Erie County CROP Hunger Walk Awards Luncheon on April 30. St. John's is only one of the 45 different churches and groups who walked in September 2023, collecting over \$78,000 to reach out in partnership to poor and hungry people, here and in more than 52 countries around the world. A video showed food ration bags being offered to families who are suffering from both drought and floods in the Tana River Valley of Kenya.

Erie County's CROP Walk ranks 9th in the nation for the funds raised. At the luncheon, 23 Local hunger-fighting agencies received grants from the portion of funds (25%) that remain in Erie County. One such agency is the Emmaus Ministries, who daily feed 200 people, including one man who walks 15 blocks to come for a meal and fellowship!

The goal for the Sunday, September 29, 2024 CROP Walk in Erie County is \$80,000. St. John's members can participate as walkers and donors. Let's mark our calendars, lace up our shoes, and get in training for this worthy event! Diane and Carolyn welcome your interest.

Hooked on Books at Abiding Hope's "Lunch and Listen"

Dean Baldwin, president of Hooked on Books, will reveal what's between the covers of this 30-year-old program on Wednesday, June 12, when Abiding Hope Lutheran Church invites friends to bring a sandwich at noon. They provide beverages and sweets! Hooked on Books stores its volumes in a basement room under St. John's gym, but they aren't hiding there. The program's mission is to provide brand-new, high-quality books to needy children and youth in Erie County from birth to age 18. Training offered for Eucharistic Ministers

Members of St. John's who are unable to attend services due to illness or mobility issues miss out on the sacrament of the Lord's Supper unless someone visits them. A "Eucharistic Minister" is a person trained and designated to carry the elements of communion to such a member, maintaining a connection of fellowship with one who is absent from our worship services. Active pastors in the Erie Lutheran Conference have volunteered to hold a training session for new or existing Eucharistic Ministers.
