

NWPA Synod Assembly Theme—I Love Telling the Story

In the middle of June, Butch Karnes and I represented St. John's as voting members at the Synod Assembly held on Thiel College campus. I arrived on Thursday afternoon before the meeting began, because I knew that I wanted ample time to set up my spartan college kid townhouse bunk for maximum comfort. I slept well in the two nights there. Butch says his one night was not very restful.

We ate meals in the dining hall, supplementing our appetites with coffee and WELCA-provided cookies during business sessions.

About 100 people gathered, including 66 lay delegates, 22 rostered leaders (pastors), 10 retired pastors, and one youth. You can find the agenda for Synod Assembly 2024 on the NWPA Synod website. In general, we heard reports from Bishop Lozano and his staff, and we learned about the good work of the many organizations affiliated with the ELCA on national and local levels. We celebrated the anniversaries of congregations and rostered leaders. When voting by electronic devices for synodical officers and positions was delayed by technical difficulties, the Bishop shared Dad jokes. Others took the challenge and brought their own jokes to the microphone!

What about the stories? As Christians and as congregations, we have a story to tell of our God at work in our lives. Our Synod leaders serve as resources to help congregations connect with our communities to fill needs. A new "Go Tell it IN the Mountains" program has three goals, to equip ordained and lay preachers to use traditional and non-traditional techniques to communicate the gospel, to recruit and educate aspiring preachers, and to help congregations integrate the gospel message into their attitudes, actions, and ministries in daily life. This new program is a partner-ship with Allegheny Synod, Upper Susquehanna Synod, and NWPA Synod, funded by a grant of \$1,250,000 through the Lilly Endowment, Inc.

Using an excellent booklet "Worship at the Assembly," we opened each day and closed our Synod, accompanied by organ, piano, and the combo of Michele Flaherty on guitar, Pastor Young on box drum, and Erika Harper, voice. Our closing prayer:

"Direct us, O Lord God, in all our doings with your most gracious favor, and extend to us your continual help; that in all our works begun, continued, and ended in you, we may glorify your holy name; and finally by your mercy, bring us to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen."

Green Corner NWPA Synod Green Team

Lutherlyn Environmental Education Program (LEEP)

The Lutherlyn Environmental Education Program (LEEP) offers learning adventures for all ages, based on an understanding of God's creation and our responsibility as its stewards. It is renowned throughout western Pennsylvania for its high quality, science-oriented programs and takes full advantage of Camp Lutherlyn's 660 acres of deciduous forests, coniferous plantations, streams, lakes, wetlands, meadows, and fields. Whether you are looking for a school field trip, an educator workshop, a church youth group activity, a scout program, a service project, or a family outing, LEEP has opportunities for you.

When youth attend summer camp at Lutherlyn, they participate in at least one LEEP nature activity during the week. One option is to visit the sustainable homestead at Terra Dei, the first straw bale house built in Pennsylvania. Here campers learn about ways people can use less resources, with a focus on renewable energy and everyday solutions to ecological problems. Campers might also visit the organic garden on-site to learn about the importance of using fewer chemicals, habitat creation, and growing things in a way that works alongside natural systems instead of against them.

Throughout the week campers are also encouraged to reduce food waste (including helping with composting in the dining hall), conserve electricity and water, and to act in ways that don't damage the natural surroundings. Ultimately, this results in young people who are more mindful of the environmental implications of their lifestyles. LEEP hopes that all these experiences will make taking care of creation second nature to campers – something ingrained in their daily lives as well as something they can actively participate in and be passionate about.

There are several opportunities to visit Lutherlyn throughout the year, including LEEP's "Saturday Safaris" - nature events that are open to the public and held four times a year. One winter safari annually is maple sugaring, where attendees are exposed to the science and history of making maple syrup through an interdisciplinary study of tree identification, tree biology, and the cultural importance of maple syrup for the Native Americans and early American pioneers. Additionally, this safari looks at care for creation by talking about the impact of acid rain and climate change on the health of maple trees. The other three safaris, each with a component theme of care for creation, rotate through different topics such as Native American history, archaeology, owl ecology, and birdwatching.

Upcoming LEEP Saturday Safaris:

9/7/2024: Gardening, Habitats, and Energy Efficient Living - Discover green living possibilities at Lutherlyn's Terra Dei Homestead. Explore organic gardening, natural pest control, and enriching your environment by creating habitats for wildlife. (Registration deadline: September 2)

11/2/2024: Survival Skills - Learn some of the essentials to surviving in the forest alone, such as being prepared, building a shelter, and building a fire. (Registration deadline: October 28)
