

Resting in Peace

Halloween décor often includes gravestones with the inscription "RIP" for "rest in peace." Perhaps adding reminders of our mortality among the fun of jack-o-lanterns, black cats, candy, and skeletons on our own front yards helps to soften feelings of sadness when we view cemeteries.

Lacking a clear history of the cemetery on the grounds of St. John's Lutheran Church, I have been researching with the goal of documenting what I learn. A brief outline follows.

In 1835, the German Evangelical fathers and mothers of St. John's church had more serious thoughts when they purchased five acres of land from Conrad Braun Sr. for a burial ground and a site for a future church building. It wasn't until 1861 that they dedicated a church on this site, but burials began on the block that is now known as "Luther Square" at least as early as 1836. A stone tablet just north of the Dufford Terrace parking lot contains 30 names with birth and death dates, all the names that Audrey Hettrick and Jim Scott could connect with the St. John's church-yard burial ground. These words appear at the bottom of the tablet "And we honor those also buried here whose names are known only to God." Burial dates on the tablet range from 1836 to 1868. When construction in Luther Square has disturbed human remains, they have been reinterred, but their location is not exact. The vault below the tablet contains the ancient and broken headstones from over 100 years ago.

The Erie Cemetery was developed in 1851. This new cemetery invited several Erie churches to pay a nominal \$1 in exchange for an area where they could move burials from their churchyards for reinterment. It is not clear to what extent the St. John's congregation may have followed this practice, although I have learned recently of one family whose loved one was moved from the St. John's cemetery, most likely to a privately owned site in the Erie Cemetery.

Jim Scott and Carolyn Sturtevant visited the Erie Cemetery Office on Monday, September 23, 2024, and received a map of the cemetery marking five sections granted for St. John's use, along with the names and other information about the 316 people buried here. Burial dates range from 1867 to 2020. These grave plots were not to be sold, only to be assigned by the congregation. No grave plots remain to be used in St. John's five areas within the NN section. Further up the same lane, in Section 15, a tall column and smaller headstones mark the burial sites of the Benze family, including former pastors Rev. Adolph Leopold Benze and Rev. Gustave Adolph Benze.

On All Saints' Day in early November, we remember the loved ones whose earthly remains we have commended to their graves. We are grateful for cemeteries that maintain their final resting places in dignity among beautiful settings. May they rest in eternal peace.



Sometimes in Our Own Back Yard...

Many times we look high and low for persons, places and things that will teach us about the environment and how to care for our wonderful, God-given earth. And sometimes there is something right in our own back yard which is a precious gem that might get overlooked. This month we want to highlight the <u>Tom Ridge Environmental Center (TREC) at Presque Isle State Park in Erie, PA</u>. This state-of-the-art, green-designed facility encourages visitors to experience the unique history and everchanging, diverse ecosystems of Presque Isle State Park. It is the first building in the Pennsylvania Bureau of State Parks to earn a LEED silver certification rating.

TREC is an educational center dedicated to teaching visitors about the unique 3,200 acres of Presque Isle and the many different forms of life that inhabit the peninsula. **TREC** also serves as a center for research -- contributing to conservation efforts and promoting environmental awareness, helping to preserve the unparalleled beauty of Presque Isle and Lake Erie, the site of Pennsylvania's only seashore.

While some facilities along the Great Lakes offer environmental education and others do research, only the **TREC** offers research, education, and visitor services in one place, making it a unique destination for learning, wonder and fun. **TREC** is open year-round and offers free admission to its interactive exhibits, glass-enclosed tower and orientation movie. Learn about the history of Presque Isle and how you can contribute to keeping it healthy, pristine and beautiful. Perhaps you can plan a day trip to Erie to enjoy and learn more about this wonderful gift to the community.
