

A Season of Gratitude

November is a season of changes. Daylight Savings Time ends, and the hours of darkness shift and shrink. Cooler winds shake the leaves—now on the ground instead of in the branches above. November is the end of the Liturgical Year for Christians, since December's Advent season begins the church year, one month ahead of the January calendar year. Confusing? Maybe it's best just to focus on gratitude as we approach Thanksgiving.

We can give thanks for God's faithfulness to St. John's as a congregation of people who worship and work together. We have gathered for worship each weekend, in the pews and in front of electronic screens. We celebrated Christmas, marked the solemnity of Lent while we shared soup, took our tureens and tickets to Waldameer, and met around the meeting table to plan and decide how to be good stewards of the time and resources placed in our hands. We have commended beloved members to the Church Triumphant. Pastor Mineo's "What it Means to be a Lutheran" fed our need for greater understanding of our faith tradition, and new members have joined our fellowship!

Throughout the past months, our historic building has been illuminated, and sidewalks have been repaired. Fresh, cool water flows from the fountain in the gym, and we will be warmed in winter by new boilers. Planning has resumed for repairs to the flood damage in the Rec Room. Our facilities provide a roof over our own activities, and those of others: Youth Group, Brew Crew, Project Dignity, AA, Hooked on Books, Gem City Band rehearsals and concerts, Scouts, Social Dancing, school recreation, and countless other community events. We continue our care for Dufford Terrace and its residents.

St. John's is one congregation among many who can celebrate the Lord's faithfulness at Thanksgiving. In our conversations with churches in the Erie Lutheran Conference, we share concerns for our future in the face of declining attendance, and we appreciate the efforts of each community of faith as they minister to others. Bishop Lozano had been hosting a series of 6 weekly online meetings with lay leaders of the NWPA Synod, calling the series "Equipping the Saints."

November begins with the hymn "For All the Saints," honoring those whose lives were marked by their love for the family of God. They passed that legacy to us. As November draws to a close, our hymn will be "Now Thank We All Our God."

Flags to Honor Veterans

Scout Troop 9 will place US flags along sidewalks around St. John's on Saturday, November 9 in honor of Veteran's Day, observed Monday, November 11. This national holiday commemorates the armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities in Europe in the war we now call World War I. Although the official end of the war came with the Treaty of Versailles on June 28, 1919, opponents agreed to end fighting on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918. A plaque near the Peach Street doors lists the names of St. John's men who served in WWI.
