

"I'll be Home for Christmas..."

Wikipedia informs me that this popular Christmas standard was written by lyricist Kim Gannon and composer Walter Kent, and it became a top ten hit for Bing Crosby when he recorded it in 1943. Originally, it reflected the desire of overseas servicemen to be away from the battlefields, and to be home with family and friends for the holiday season. The sentiments of this timeless song fit every person who longs for the warmth of family and home, with an oven spreading delicious aromas and with lights in the windows.

In October, I read a book set in Appalachia, <u>Demon Copperhead</u>, by my favorite living author, Barbara Kingsolver. Her character, whose real name is Damon, lacks father, mother, and home, due to the economic struggles that cause many to fall into substance abuse. Damon's childhood and teen years play out in a series of foster homes, surrounded by people both flawed and supportive.

While reading this book, I also visited family in West Virginia, where nephew Ben and his wife Christy have been involved in faith-based recovery programs for several years. They openly testify to the pain in their home due to past substance abuse and feelings of anger, rejection, and inadequacy. In Monday night Recovery Alive meetings, Ben and plays guitar, and Christy leads sessions of praising God, their higher *Power*, with a group of *People* supporting each other, applying a 12-step *Process* to bring healing to their lives. Their newest project has been the restoration and dedication of an old building into the "Victoria House," which will be a home to six women in recovery. Hundreds of people brought muscle and tools to repair the building, and hundreds of boxes from the Amazon wish list carried gifts to furnish the rooms.

As the first two women moved in this week, Christy apologized that the house lacks TV and internet, and she realized that the negative aspects are eclipsed by the benefits of a stable shelter with electricity, heat, kitchen appliances to create warm and wholesome meals. In Victoria House, and in four other Recovery Alive houses, two for women and two for men, the residents will have a safe home away from the battles that interrupted their lives. Our family is proud of the faith, vision, and energy that Christy and Ben have invested in reclaiming peace, love, and trust in their own home, and in extending that hospitality to others in need of a home during recovery.

St. John's participation in the cold-weather Overflow Shelter, "Our Neighbor's Place," is a way that we offer safety and warmth to those who are without a home. Diane is recruiting volunteers to prepare meals and to cover evening shifts at the new location. The organizers of the shelter hope to include social services to help Erie's homeless population find more permanent housing.

As we gather in our own homes, may our generosity be inspired by the life and love of an infant born far from home, in a temporary shelter, yet celebrated each year at Christmas.

Creation Care with Eco-Friendly Wrapping

As Christmas approaches, here are some ideas for earth-friendly wrapping. Consider using alternatives to traditional wrapping, such as:

Newspaper or brown paper rolls (kids can decorate with markers or Christmas card cut-outs)

Reusable shopping bags (preferably cotton)

Re-use gift bags (make it fun - see how many years you can use the same one)

Christmas cards make great gift tags

Wrap items in a t-shirt

Wrap items in a tablecloth or blanket

Instead of ribbon,

Use 100% cotton yarn (such as Sugar and Cream, available in many colors)

Use jute twine (100% biodegradable); add a fresh holly sprig for color

Avoid shiny, glossy wrapping, as it is not recyclable

If giving multiple gifts to a person/family, place them unwrapped in one (reusable) bag and have the recipient select one at a time. (No peeking inside first!)
