

"Things happen for a reason"

When ending a phone conversation about my broken elbow, a friend commented, "Things happen for a reason." I know this friend in a context where we are of various backgrounds and beliefs, and we are more likely to speak about cause-and-effect rather than any single divine purpose behind earthly happenings. In my case, the cause of my broken elbow was a sudden slip of my boots on an icy driveway. The effects are the discomfort, surgery, and months-long recovery. Happily, medical treatment and time promise healing, if I can just be patient with the inconvenience of living as a righthanded person.

"Things happen for a reason" can lead to the difficult question, "Why do bad things happen to good people?" When we look beyond our own worries, we see the struggles of people dealing with floods, fires, tornados, and earthquakes. Our faith generally acknowledges that "he [the Lord] makes his sun rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust." (Matthew 5:45)

When young Fred Rogers, "Mr. Rogers," saw fearful things on the news, his mother told him to "Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping." It is comforting and humbling to be helped by prayers, a card of encouragement, a meal, a ride, a phone call in time of need. Could closer relationships with our helpers and a growing sense of gratitude be reasons and lessons coming from certain unfortunate happenings? We have limited control over some events in our lives; we can choose how we respond. Receiving kindness from others, we learn to be kind.

"Things happen for a reason." Scripture readings of the upcoming Holy Week tell us that God was intentional in sending His son as a teacher and as a sacrifice for us. The suffering of one man offers salvation to all. His resurrection gives us a reason to respond in gratitude, love, and joy!

Eucharist Ministry Training

Through connections in the Erie Lutheran Conference (ELC), a training session for veteran and new eucharistic ministers occurred on Sunday, March 23rd. Pastor Kuebler, of Faith Lutheran Church in Harborcreek and Dean of the ELC, led the training session. Six members from St. John's, one member from Immanuel Lutheran Church, and Pastor Mineo reviewed the ways in which a eucharistic minister brings elements of worship and the Lord's Supper to members at home. The St. John's members will be working to prepare a list of our homebound and hospitalized members who might want communion and to establish a schedule to record distribution.

ELC Shared Ministry Retreat

Tim Durst represented St. John's at a March 25th event at Prince of Peace Church, attended by pastors and members from eleven churches of the Erie Lutheran Conference (ELC). Their discussions identified known challenges common to many congregations, namely the increasing age of parishioners, the decrease or lack of young members, and the scarcity of pastors to fill pulpits as our rostered clergy retire, in some cases, for a second time! Organizers plan to send a survey to each ELC congregation asking them to consider options for the future.

Bahm/Palmer Funds Support Youth

Through the generosity of past members of St. John's, young people in our congregation may receive financial assistance for certain needs. The Bahm/Palmer Committee administers the funds. Recently, several young people received camperships for Camp Lutherlyn by having their families complete a Bahm/Palmer application form that can be obtained from the office. Below are some basics about the two funds.

Guidelines for Bahm and Palmer Trusts Purpose: In accordance with the wills of Marguerite Bahm and Donald Palmer, the funds bequeathed to St. John's will be used to:

1. assist with educational costs of children (Pre-K- thru age 18) who attend tuitionbased schools (Palmer)

2. assist with undergraduate educational costs of youth and young adults (ages 18

- 26) who attend tuition-based college/university/technical school (Bahm)

3. assist with medical expenses for children birth to 17 years of age (Palmer)

4. assist with alleviating the need for food, clothing and shelter (Bahm)

Eligibility:

1. The beneficiary must be a member of St. John's for at least one year prior to distribution of funds

2. The beneficiary must be a member in good standing at the time the expense was incurred (attend at least once in current or preceding calendar year)

Raising the Roof for a Church in Tanzania!

As described in the March Parish Post, Bishop Lozano has suggested that churches of the NWPA Synod pledge their Lenten offerings to buy metal roofing for the church buildings that will house new congregations in Tanzania. An average building may need 500 metal panels at \$10 apiece. Following Bishop Lozano's recommendation, Council voted to set a St. John's goal of buying enough sheets to put a roof on one church, a total of \$5000! During Lent, money placed in Lenten envelopes and in plate offerings is going toward this goal. As of March 31, St. John's members have contributed \$2728, or 54.5% of our goal!

Rec Room Progress!

The Property Committee reports that Jackson Plumbing has prepared the floor and walls in a bathroom in the basement Rec Room. Tiles may arrive in a few weeks. There's no date for completion, but there is forward motion toward reclaiming the entire space damaged by the flood! While working on the lower level, the crew is also tackling a large rough patch on a plaster wall in the large room where Project Dignity neighbors gather. Council thanks the congregation for their monthly donations in the Recreation Room Repair envelopes.

1960s Teen Choir Cameo on WQLN Chronicles!

WQLN recently aired an episode about the life of local musician, Harry T. Burleigh (1866-1949). His musical opportunities in Erie eventually took him to New York City and European stages as a famous baritone. Pictures of Erie choirs flashed on the screen to illustrate the musical environment of the city of Burleigh's origin. What a surprise to see a photo of a group of red-robed teen girls standing on the steps in St. John's sanctuary! The WQLN Chronicles team had scanned the photo while filming "Houses of Faith." If memory serves, the singers included Nancy Sheldon Durst, Alice Pifer Zimmerly, Wendy Thayer, Emily Askounes, and Carolyn Sturtevant, along with former organist, Dorothy Steward.


