

"Quem quaeritas in sepulchro, o Christicolae?"

These words came to mind on Easter Sunday, as we heard the story of women finding not the body of Jesus, but active angels at the empty tomb. In college several decades ago, this English major learned that such scenes enacted in church were among the roots of theater. Costumed characters illustrated the Resurrection story to those in early churches who had neither books nor the ability to read.

The question begins, "Whom do you seek, followers of Christ?"

The three Mary's answer, "Jesus of Nazareth, the Crucified, O heavenly ones."

The Angels respond, "He is not here, he is risen, just as he foretold. Go, announce that he is risen from the sepulchre."

Ecclesiastical theater has crowded out regularly scheduled television programming for the funeral of Queen Elizabeth and the coronation of her son, King Charles. More recently, we've witnessed the televised funerals of President Jimmy Carter and Pope Francis. Presidential inaugurations command the airwaves. The pre-planned settings, costumes, music, and carefully scripted movements enhance the occasions. Theatrical trappings mark many other events: football and futball games, the NFL draft, the Olympics, commencement exercises, weddings, parades, and holiday celebrations.

The main roles of public events are acted out up front, on the stages, playing fields, and in front of the cameras. What is expected of the audience? They are to come in the spirit of the occasion, both on appearance and behavior. In the words of advice colleague Nate received before arriving for his Library of Congress internship, "Show up and look smart." For world leaders at the funeral for the Bishop of Rome, there were a dress code and assigned seats. We hope that their presence signifies that they will honor Pope Francis by following his example of humility and compassion, and by taking to heart his message of peace as they lead their respective countries in challenging times.

Each worship service at St. John's is our own ecclesiastical celebration. "*Quem quaeritas--*Whom do we seek, follow, and announce?" Each of us plays a role in the Resurrection story.

The Shared Ministry Task Force wishes to move the deliberations from mere talk within a committee of delegates to a poll of each member in the ELC.

St. John's will print, distribute, collect, and submit paper copies in coming weeks to anyone who wishes to use paper copies. 

Pentecost Garden


