NWPA Synod Assembly Report

Butch Karnes and I had the pleasure of representing St. John's at the recent NWPA Synod Assembly meeting at Thiel College on June 13-14th, 2025.

The main order of business this year was the election of the Synodical Bishop for NWPA. The Assembly meeting officially started Wednesday, June 11th at 7:00 PM where we reviewed and discussed the proposed budget, tested the electronic voting system, and performed the 1st ballot which gathered the nominations for the candidacy for Bishop. The first list of nominees was presented, and the meeting was recessed until Friday, June13th at 9:00 AM.

Five candidates moved forward to the 2nd ballot – Bishop Michael Lozano, Reverend Brenda Martin, Reverend Kristin Kern-Papson, Reverend Tom Glasoe, and Reverend Tedd Cogar. After hearing profile information from each candidate, the second ballot was held with no election. All five candidates moved forward to the 3rd ballot. After hearing a 5-to-7-minute presentation by each candidate, the third ballot was held with no election. The top three candidates – Bishop Lozano, Reverend Kern-Papson, and Reverend Martin moved forward to the 4th ballot. After each candidate answered 3 questions from the election committee, the fourth ballot was held with no election. Bishop Lozano and Reverend Kern-Papson moved forward to the 5th and final ballot.

Reverend Kristen Kern-Papson was elected with a vote count of 49 to 45. Her six-year term in office starts September 1, 2025, and her installation as bishop is October 19th, 2025, at Good Hope Lutheran Church in Oil City. Please keep Bishop-elect Kern-Papson and her family in your prayers as she begins the transition from the role of pastor to Mt. Calvary and Lamb of God in Erie to bishop of our seventy-one congregations across thirteen counties of northwestern Pennsylvania.

The ballots, presentations, and the election committee reports were interspersed throughout the day and a half meeting. In between this important work, we heard presentations from several committees and organizations within our synod. Groups such as committee on church vocations, Camp Lutherlyn, Bethesda Lutheran Services, ELCA Foundation Gift Planning, the synod Green Team, and the ELCA churchwide representative shared challenges and milestones with the assembly.

Additionally, we voted on recommendations from the synod council, the budget, and a replacement female representative to the Churchwide Assembly that will meet in Phoenix, Arizona, from July 28th to August 2nd.

We worshiped, prayed, and learned together. We recognized anniversaries of rostered leaders and congregations, and we celebrated the mission and ministry of Pastor Harold "Jake" Jacobson as he retires later this summer.

Thank you again for this amazing opportunity to represent St. John's in this important work of the church.

Notice of a SPECIAL MEETING of the congregation of St. John's Lutheran regarding an update to the Bylaws of Dufford Terrace, Inc.

Due to IRS Tax Law requirements for 501(C)3 corporations, Dufford Terrace must amend the Dufford Terrace Bylaws to include a Dissolution Clause. The Dissolution Clause is a statement that explains what said organization will do with its assets in the event that the organization dissolves. We must call a Special Meeting of the St. John's Congregation to vote on this change to the bylaws.

Also included will be a vote on an additional update related to Term Limits of an elected Dufford Officer.

A Special Meeting will be held immediately following the 10:00 AM Service of Worship on Sunday, July 13, 2025. A quorum of 40 members is required.

If a quorum is not reached at the first meeting, a second meeting attempt will be held immediately following the 10:00 AM Service of Worship on Sunday, July 27, 2025.

If a quorum is not reached at the second meeting, a third and final meeting will be held immediately following the 10:00 AM Service of Worship on Sunday, August 17, 2025, at which time the number attending will be accepted as a quorum.

The agenda for the Special Meeting(s) will be strictly limited to the following:

Vote on Article To be added to the Bylaws:

Article XIII -- Dissolution Clause

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, as may be selected by the Board of Directors of this Corporation, to be used for, and devoted to, the purpose of carrying on a nonprofit housing project for independent living residents aged 62 and above, or to create an endowment for St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Erie, PA, or for another purpose to promote the general social welfare of the community of Erie County, PA. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes provided that nothing herein shall prohibit the Corporation from paying its just debts.

Vote to Update Bylaws regarding Term Limits for Board Officers:

Term Limit Language to be added (in italics):

Article 5.2 Term. Each officer shall hold office for a term of one (1) year, commencing on the first day of the month following his or her election, and may succeed himself or herself twice. After having served three terms, the officer may remain on the Board in accordance with Article IV, Sections 4.3, 4.4, and 4.5 but not hold that same office for a period of 1 year. However, if no other eligible and willing candidate is nominated, or steps forward to serve in that officer role at the time of election, the current officer may continue to serve beyond the term limit on a year-to-year basis, subject to annual approval by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. Such continued service shall not be considered a new term for the purposes of term limits and is intended solely to ensure continuity of leadership when necessary.
